HELP US RAISE £20,000 TO PROVIDE WATER FOR A VILLAGE IN TURKANA (KENYA)
BY TAKING ON THE PEAKS OF SCOTLAND

Tinto – Coulter Fell – Green Lowther – Conic

Join us to overcome some of Scotland's most dramatic peaks across a weekend. It will be a fantastic challenge as well as helping to raise money that will provide water for those in great need in Turkana, Northern Kenya.



It's 3 Peaks for 30 years of New Ways on the Saturday taking on Lanarkshire's highest 3 Peaks – Tinto (711m), Coulter Fell (748m), and Green Lowther (732m) with a combined walking distance of 25km. Three remote hills to see Scotland at it's best. A bigger day than Ben Nevis with much less people!

Then on Sunday we tackle Conic Hill which is 11km and 443m which is more than worth it to give the best views possible over Loch Lomond (weather dependent!).

So over the two days, it 2,634m elevation and 36km - Medium fitness level required.

Included in the package is:

- Two nights accommodation in the same hotel both nights in the west end of Glasgow
- Bed and breakfast basis for the Friday night due to people arriving at different times, and dinner bed and breakfast on the Saturday night
- Packed lunch on the Saturday
- Café lunch on the Sunday
- Transport from Glasgow Airport to the hotel on Friday evening and back to Glasgow Airport after Conic Hill, getting to the airport late Sunday afternoon
- Qualified Mountain Leader and qualified first aid cover
- Event manager
- Training plan and equipment list
- Public liability insurance



Itinerary

(all times are estimations)

Friday 4th September

Own travel to Glasgow Airport where transport will be provided at agreed times to the hotel in Glasgow's west end.

Saturday 5th September

7.30am: depart hotel

8.30am: start up Tinto completing at approximately 10.30am

11.30 noon: start up Coulter Fell completing at approximately 2pm

3pm: start up Green Lowther completing at approximately 5.30pm

Visit to the Wanlockhead Inn which is in Wanlockhead, the highest village in Scotland!

7pm: arrive back at the hotel

8pm: dinner

Sunday 6th September

8am: depart hotel

9am: start walk from the attractive village of Drymen along the West Highland Way

12.30pm: arrive in Balmaha on the east shore of Loch Lomond via Conic Hill for lunch

2pm: depart Balmaha for Glasgow Airport

3pm: arrive at Glasgow Airport

Cost: £650 per person excluding travel to and back from Glasgow Airport (or elsewhere in Glasgow) to your home.
